

MONDAY

WALT: Adapt writing style to suit the reader and purpose.

Y6 Task: It's time to reflect on your primary education and experience. Write about a favourite memory of your time in Adamsdown.

Y5 Task: You will be the oldest pupils in the school in September, you will be looked up to by your new class mates especially. Write a informative and positive message to the new year 5 children coming to join Upper School.

Success criteria:

- Include a brief introduction about yourself
- Use your experiences and explain why these are important
- Use a slightly informal tone (these pieces can be funny)
- Use appropriate vocabulary suitable to the situation

Plenary: Record your message or memory to share with your peers. You could use flipgrid or Adobe to produce this.

WALT: Design and make art, both imaginatively and expressively, using a variety of processes.

Task: It is the end of the year, and for a lot of us, the end of our time at Adamsdown! Create a collage which represents you and your time at Adamsdown. You could use the school twitter accounts to remind you of events and special moments and even use some of the images in your collage. You can use online tools such as Adobe Spark to create a static poster or a slideshow video. You could use an online app like Pic Collage, or you can create one using pictures, photos and paper and make a physical collage, the choice is yours!

Success criteria:

- Make the collage a representation of YOU not just the school
- Add photos, pictures, images, drawings, words and colours that represent your time in Adamsdown
- Don't be afraid to get creative with sizes, fonts, vocabulary etc.

Plenary: If you have created a collage on Hwb, share it with classmates and create a collaborative slideshow of all your collages!

WALT: Communicate for a range of purposes, e.g. to convey feelings

Task: We would usually create these farewell videos for our leavers assembly. Unfortunately, the assembly is not possible this year, but we can still leave our goodbye and goodluck messages. Create a 'Goodbye' video. This video could be to your classmates or teachers (if you are Year6). Year 5, you could include a goodluck message to the year 6s going onto high school.

Success criteria:

- Speak clearly
- Maintain appropriate volume
- Use emphasis and intonation for effect
- Ensure your face is in shot

Plenary: Have a go at editing your video, can you include some moving music in the background, add any pictures from your memories collage work?

THURSDAY

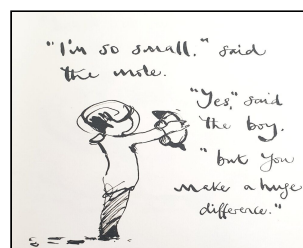
WALT: Create and present information and ideas
